## **HEALTH ADVISORY**

### **North Dakota Department of Health Coordinating Health and Medical Professionals Interested in Volunteering for Hurricane Katrina Response**

The North Dakota Department of Health is coordinating a list of health and medical volunteers interested in potentially assisting with response to Hurricane Katrina.

Public health or private medical professionals who would like to be considered for a response team are asked to register through the state's Public Health Emergency Volunteer Reserve (PHEVR). Registration can be completed online at [www.ndhan.gov](http://www.ndhan.gov) using the "Hurricane Katrina" link.

Deployment of volunteers from North Dakota will be made through North Dakota Department of Emergency Services using the Emergency Management Assistance Compact (EMAC). Through EMAC, a disaster-impacted state can request and receive assistance from other member states. Responding through EMAC is necessary to ensure that volunteers are protected from unforeseen accidents, injuries and legal actions.

The United States Department of Health and Human Services (HHS) has also developed a website for federal deployment of medical responders. To avoid duplication, North Dakota responders are asked to volunteer on the Health Alert Network site ([www.ndhan.gov](http://www.ndhan.gov)) and not the HHS site. After people register with the state, that information will be provided by the Department of Health to the HHS.

If a request for health and medical assistance is received, the Department of Health will contact registered volunteers who fit the requested roles; therefore, some people who volunteer may not be contacted to serve. Prior to deployment, the department will provide guidelines about necessary preparations and supplies the volunteers will need. People should not incur any expenses unless contacted and deployed by the state.

*Categories of Health Alert messages:*

- *Health Alert conveys the highest level of importance; warrants immediate action or attention.*
- *Health Advisory provides important information for a specific incident or situation; may not require immediate action.*
- *Health Update provides updated information regarding an incident or situation; no immediate action necessary.*
- *Health Information provides general information that is not necessarily considered to be of an emergent nature.*
